- Week of the Young Child In April, DIEEC and deaeyc partnered to spotlight early learning, young children, and their teachers, families and communities. Targeted PLEs

Let's Go Outside - We facilitated 2 cohorts of this 15-hour PLE series that supports early childhood professionals in learning about nature-based outdoor learning, and enhancing their program's outdoor learning environment. Shining the Light on You - This 15-week program for family child care educators focuses on improving participants' health and well-being through weekly group sessions and health coaching; in 2023, we facilitated 3 cohorts, including 2 for Spanish-speaking educators. Leadership Cohort - A group of 9 program leaders engaged together through a series of 4 PLEs focused on strengthening leadership skills, including workshops, group reflective experiences, and individual coaching. RENEW

As we all renew our commitment to providing Delaware's children with high quality care and education, here are just a few of the things you can look forward to with DIEEC in 2024.

- A new and improved DIEEC website, including a Resource Hub that will make it faster and easier to find the information you need.
- **Professional Preparation:** Early Childhood Education Cohort is an update to TECE I & II coursework, kicking off in January. Stay tuned for updates on this pilot program.
- A PLE series based on the Zero to Three Critical Competencies for Infant-Toddler Educators will be piloted starting in February.
- **Physical Activity Learning Sessions (PALS)** is a hybrid PLE focused on incorporating more physical activity into your classroom. The pilot started last week; look for more opportunities in the future!
- **Season Two of the DIEEC Podcast:** X Why Z, Reflections from Early Childhood Education Professionals–Strengthening the ECE Workforce during a Crisis.
- **Annual initiatives:** Provider Appreciation, Early Childhood Educator of the Year, and Week of the Young Child. Theme for Week of the Young Child: Creating Universal Learning Environments.
- A self-paced option for quality improvement planning will be introduced to interested family child care programs in early 2024.
- Ongoing support for Delaware's early childhood education programs. We provide technical assistance to all programs, and we are ready to partner with any programs that wish to engage in the quality improvement planning process as a required step toward applying for a Quality Improvement Award.

Let's Go Outside teaches professionals about the possibilities provided through outdoor learning, and provides a grant-funded opportunity for them to make their own outdoor classroom visions come to life. Delaware Early Childhood Educator of the Year Changes coming in 2024

This spring, we'll once again strive to bring public awareness to the importance of early childhood educators by announcing our annual Educator of the Year awards during the Week of the Young Child. We wanted to give you a heads up about three key changes for this year's nomination and award process. Keep an eye on DIEEC's social media and the February issue of REACH for application information.

- 1) This year, applications will be open from **February 1 through March 1**. This is earlier than in previous years.
- 2) Educators must **self-nominate** for the award. This ensures that only educators who are interested in being considered for the award are nominated.
- 3) Winners will be selected by a review panel made up of early childhood experts and educators.

A system that was once known for star-level ratings has been replaced with a system that offers a variety of supports and resources for ALL licensed early childhood education programs to encourage their continuous quality improvement. Depending on the desired level of participation, programs can engage with universal supports and targeted supports through DIEEC.
