On Friday, May 10, we will send out a short video that you can share with families via email, link on your website, and/or post to your social media. Share and let everyone know about the important work you do!


Appreciation from DIEEC:

Our April panel discussion on Welcoming All Children was so engaging that we ran out of time for the last few questions! Our expert panelists shared their perspectives on Universal Design for Learning, the Whole Child approach, culturally responsive practices, inclusion, and equity. Resource Highlight

As mentioned in the recap of our Welcoming All Children webinar, we have a collection of resources to share on the topics of Universal Design for Learning, the Whole Child approach, and diversity, equity and inclusion. We also want to ensure the early childhood community is aware of the <u>Delaware Early Childhood Inclusion</u> <u>Guide</u>. Produced by the Delaware Department of Education, the purpose of the guide is to support early childhood professionals and programs as they work to meet the needs of children with disabilities and their families.



Key Practice Highlight

As part of Delaware's revised <u>Quality Improvement System</u> for early care and education programs in Delaware, the Office of Early Learning (OEL) has prioritized five key practices for fiscal year 2024. We are highlighting one key practice each month, sharing examples of how Delaware programs are choosing to work towards higher levels of quality in the highlighted practice.

This month, we are highlighting PCHQ-KP5: Implements inclusive practices and provides environments that are responsive to the developmental needs of all children enrolled in the program.

- Delaware Tech Child Development Center Terry Campus, Dover, invested in making their cozy corners more welcoming and inclusive for children while also helping educators create a supportive classroom atmosphere. They are purchasing social-emotional competence support kits and Conscious Discipline materials like books and posters for preschool classrooms.
- The Next Step Learning Center Inc., Selbyville, is focusing on using outdoor learning environment materials that are inclusive of all learners by incorporating outdoor play materials for students with disabilities.

• Jamie Hooks, a family child care educator in Laurel, has chosen to focus on supporting individual children's needs in her family child care program. She has plans to attend Understanding Autism and Strategies for Child Care Providers, a workshop being held this month. In addition, she is researching inclusive activities to include in her daily lesson plans, including incorporating a picture schedule and learning to use sign language as a way to communicate with children who are not yet verbal.



Quality Improvement Award Documentation Reminder from OEL

If you received a Quality Improvement Award during the 2023-2024 program year, documentation sharing how you spent the funds is due to the Office of Early Learning by the close of business on May 15, 2024. Please upload documentation to the "Evidence" tab that can be found within your application on the Delaware ECE Portal.

If you need to make changes to your budget narrative, please forward requests to Takeisha Edmonds at <u>Takeisha.Edmonds@doe.k12.de.us</u>. Prior to submitting your request, ensure the new items placed on the budget align with state prioritized key practices. You can find these prioritized key practices on page 11 of the <u>Guide to Quality Improvement for Early Care and Education Programs in Delaware</u>. Reminders for how these funds can be used can be found on pages 15-18. **Requests for changes will not be accepted beyond May 15, 2024** as this is the deadline for programs to report on spending.

Partner Highlight: Wilmington Early Care and Education Council (WECEC)

The mission of the Wilmington Early Care & Education Council (WECEC) is that all Wilmington children can have access to an integrated early childhood system which fosters collaboration among existing programs, and identifies gaps in current delivery systems for children birth through 8 years old.

WECEC has a Professional Development Resource Center (PDRC) located at Stubbs Elementary School in Wilmington. The PDRC offers resources and services with the goal of increasing the quality of early care and education for young children and their families in the City of Wilmington.

An array of services is available including a lending library featuring child development topics, die cuts, laminating, photocopying, scholarships for professional development, mentoring, and much more.
